I am honored to be elected as the first woman President of Tamil Nadu Foundation and to continue the journey started by our past presidents, in making a difference in the lives of people in our ancestor land. This year has been a great learning experience and an interesting start of a wonderful journey for me. I have the privilege of working with a great team of officers and board members who are passionate, dedicated, and hard working. They are focused on serving the people of Tamil Nadu and work seamlessly. The TNF Tamil Nadu Chapter Trustees led by Chairman Mr. S.Rajarethinam provide excellent guidance. Chennai Staff led by Mr. Ka. Ilango, CEO has supported and executed the projects promptly and with great fiscal responsibility.

In 2020, we were looking forward to yet another great year and were actively planning on a wonderful Annual Convention at Michigan when the pandemic COVID-19 hit the world and disabled all of our lives as we know it... However, as the old adage goes, adversities bring out the goodness and generosity in people.

- TNF supporters all over the US helped to raise more than **\$13,000** for the **Covid-19 India Relief fund**. This money will be used for PPEs in the most affected area hospitals in Tamil Nadu.
- TNF Chapters raised about **\$12,000** for the **Covid-19 USA Relief fund** to be given to Food Banks in various cities in the U.S.
- TNF Chicago Chapter raised **\$35,000** to fund procurement of a rapid screening assay, an **RT-PCR Machine, for Stanley Medical College and Hospital** in Chennai

TNF was awarded **\$20,000** by **Adobe Community Employee Grants** for the ABC Initiative. Receiving a grant from an US-based company is prestigious and moving forward we intend to explore this avenue more.

The **ABC Education Initiative** has been steadily growing with many Chapters and individuals adopting districts and schools. To date, we have 125 partner schools in 29 districts and more than 79,000 beneficiaries. The ABC initiative opens doors for many slow learners and underserved children all over Tamil Nadu.

Mann Vaasanai is the largest and most ambitious initiative undertaken by TNF to date and is off to a great start. Its objective is to raise funds (target: **\$ 9 million-plus, \$ 250,000** per district) to sustain the TNF projects in each of the 38 districts and the Union Territory of Puducherry. In 2019 about **\$74,000** dollars were added to the program by the funds raised from 2018 and 2019 convention donations, bringing the total to approximately **\$ 400,000**. Namakkal, Nagapattinam,

and Sivagangai have raised close to 60% of Phase I goal of **Rs.50 lakhs**. With your help, we can fund all of them in the very near future.

TNF Service and Education Initiative: Since its inception the TNF Summer Internship program has enriched the lives of 134 U.S. born Tamil Youth from all across the U.S. Per the program's design and intent, these students spent time in various cities in Tamil Nadu, connecting to their roots and more importantly learning about the challenges faced by the local students in learning.

The rich experience has motivated some of these youth to start their own projects to help the children of Tamil Nadu. To date, we have seven projects created by the youth. The **TAYMAI Grants** is an extension of the project initiative and is managed by the **Young Professional Committee**. This year we also had a college graduate spend eight weeks in Tamil Nadu on a Young Adult Internship.

TNF Chapters in the U.S. are vibrant and active. They play a key role in creating awareness among our diaspora about the TNF programs and generate a significant amount of funds for the projects they support.

TNF has wholeheartedly embraced the emergence of the digital world with the publication of e-newsletter **Eegai**, updates on **Facebook** about TNF and the Chapters, **YouTube** Posts of our activities, and **Instagram** postings.

I would like to thank the **TNF 2020 Convention Coordinators** and **the team from Michigan** for their meticulous planning of what would have been a grand convention. Although we had to cancel the event due to Covid-19, we hope to host a convention in Michigan sometime soon.

I would like to thank TNF Member **Ravi Subramanyam** of New Jersey for his contributions to TNF as Editor of TNF e-magazine **Eegai** from 2019 and for editing the 2019 Convention and 2020 Annual Reports. He is detail oriented, tireless and generous.

The beautiful cover pages of the 2020 Annual report and the 2018, 2019 Convention reports and were designed by **Bala Kothandaraman** of New Jersey. I would like to thank him for his continued support to TNF.

In closing, I am proud to be a part of this wonderful organization whose primary goal is to support various initiatives for the welfare and development of the underserved people of Tamil Nadu -- in areas such as **Education, Health and Hygiene, Rural Development and Women's Empowerment**. Since the future of TNF's efforts rests squarely on the younger generation, it has also been focusing on connecting with the youth in India and in the U.S.

Thank you for your continued support for all the TNF Initiatives.

India and the USA, along with rest of the World, are grappled with the serious public health issues caused by COVID-19. Today, we find ourselves in a peculiar social order, posing many problems, which has led to the dramatic slowdown in carrying out routine activities. The Governments have taken several measures on public health issues and protection of the social order. The need of the hour is to supplement the efforts of the Government to tide over the crisis. Non-Government organisations like TNF have been extending their helping hand to bring succour to the needy.

At this stage, I must acknowledge the stellar role played by TNF in moments of crisis in Tamil Nadu. **Now I would like to record my appreciation and gratitude to the members of TNF who have donated funds for providing medical equipments to institutions fighting to control the spread of the virus.**

During the year 2019-2020, TNF has scaled up welfare activities by bringing **SIX** more Districts under the thrust area of ABC project, thus increasing the districts from the current 9 to 15 project districts covering 6602 students studying in rural government schools. Scholarships to poor students who pursue higher studies have been prioritized and a sum of Rs.4 million has been disbursed to 169 students.

Secretary's Report 2019-2020

Since our last general body meeting, the Tamil Nadu Foundation has accomplished a lot. This summary report covers the period from June 2019 to May 2020.

- TNF has successfully raised more than \$800,000 in donations for the fiscal year ending in March 31, 2020.
- Regular monthly board meetings are held every second Thursday with Board Members actively contributing to the strategy and implementation of TNF activities.
- Minutes from past meetings and Treasurer reports are reviewed and approved every month.
- TNF Chennai Center submits detailed monthly reports to the Board every month on TNF projects in the works and in progress. The Chairman of the Trustees and the Executive Directors attend the monthly board meetings.
- Elections were announced to elect two (2) General Directors. Veera Venugopal and Muruganandan Palanisamy were elected unopposed to serve from June 2020 through May 2023.
- 10 Chapters (Dallas, Austin, Houston, Philly, Connecticut, Central Ohio, Boston, Cleveland, South Florida, and Bay Area) have organized Chapter meetings and/or regional charity Events
- 38 new life members joined the organization, bringing the total to 1150 life members.
- Initiated 14 new projects
- 38 second-generation American-Tamils participated in the 2019 summer TNF Service and Education Internship program. Several went to rural schools like Arasangudi and Trichy (Dist).
- ABC Project Update
 - Implemented in 61 schools across 15 districts for a total of 6602 students
 - 22.4% progressed to regular classes during the 2018-19 academic year
 - Expanded into 8 new schools (3 in Coimbatore, 3 in Salem districts, and 2 in Chennai)
- TNF planned to build 100 new houses (construction of the basement) for those who lost their homes as a result of the Gaja cyclone. Basement for all 100 houses has now been completed.
- On July 24th, 2019, Mr. Jayaraman, the speaker of the TN assembly, inaugurated the digital Classroom project at Government Higher Secondary School, Vadasithur, Coimbatore (Dist).



MANN VAASANAI

“Mann Vaasanai” was launched by Hon’ble Governor of Tamil Nadu Thiru Banwarilal Purohit during the TNF Annual Conference at Chennai on 19th February 2019.

It is the single largest fundraising program for implementing the TNF Projects in Tamil Nadu.

The goal of the “Mann Vasanaai” initiative is to sustain the TNF Projects in all the thirty-eight districts of Tamil Nadu. **The ambitious plan is to raise at least \$250,000 for each of the 38 districts in Tamil Nadu.**

The funds will be invested by TNF Tamil Nadu Chapter as a corpus fund for each district. Only the interest generated from each of these funds will be used to expand and sustain TNF’s educational and humanitarian projects in the specific districts. In the long run, once the target is met, this will eliminate the need for seeking new funds every year to run critical programs in each district, as they will be squarely met by interest received from the corpus funds.

To date TNF has collected \$400,000. The total funds that need to be raised are over nine million dollars in order to sustain the programs in all the 38 districts.

Top Three Districts: Sivagangai, Namakkal and Nagapattinam

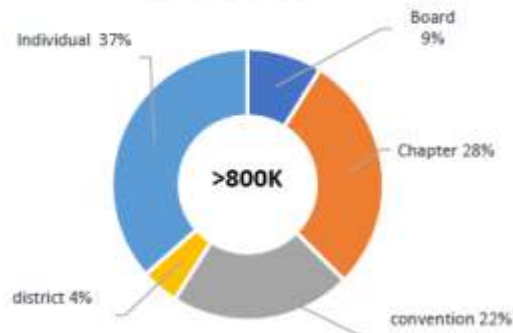

- Over 60% of donations were from the \$1000 - \$4999, \$10,000-\$24,999, and > 25000 ranges.



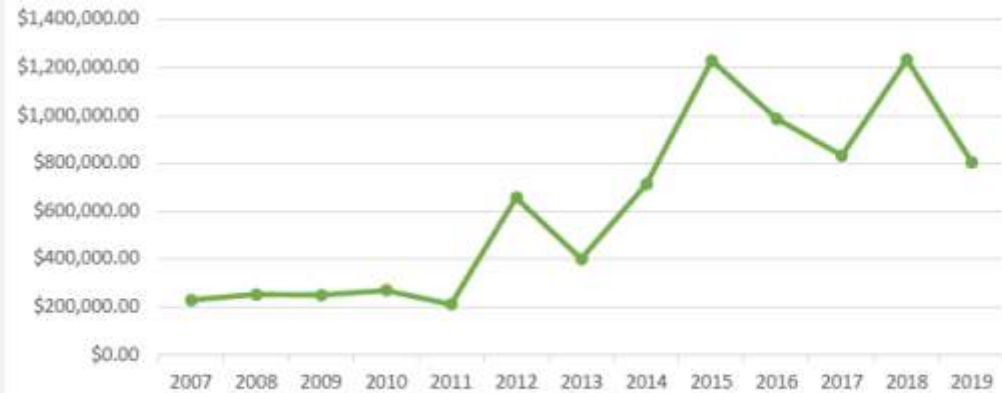

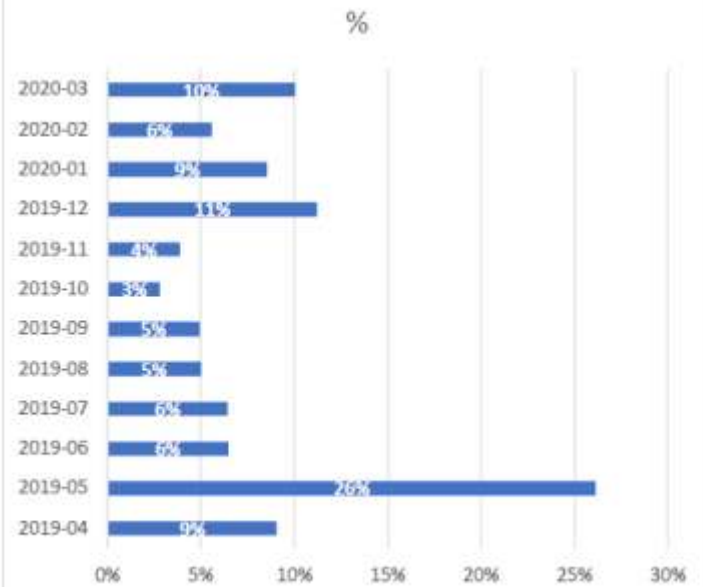
TNF Project Type



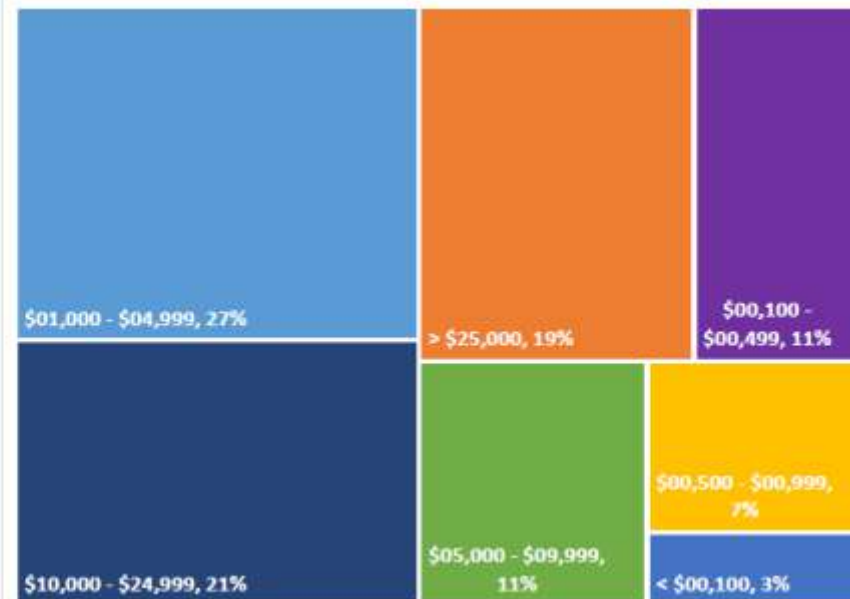

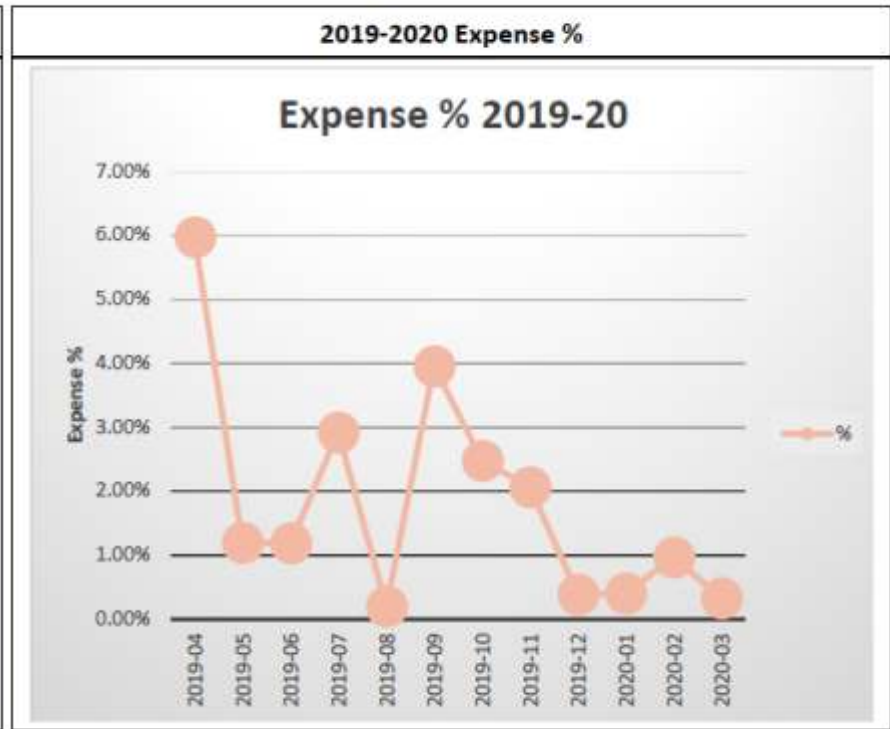
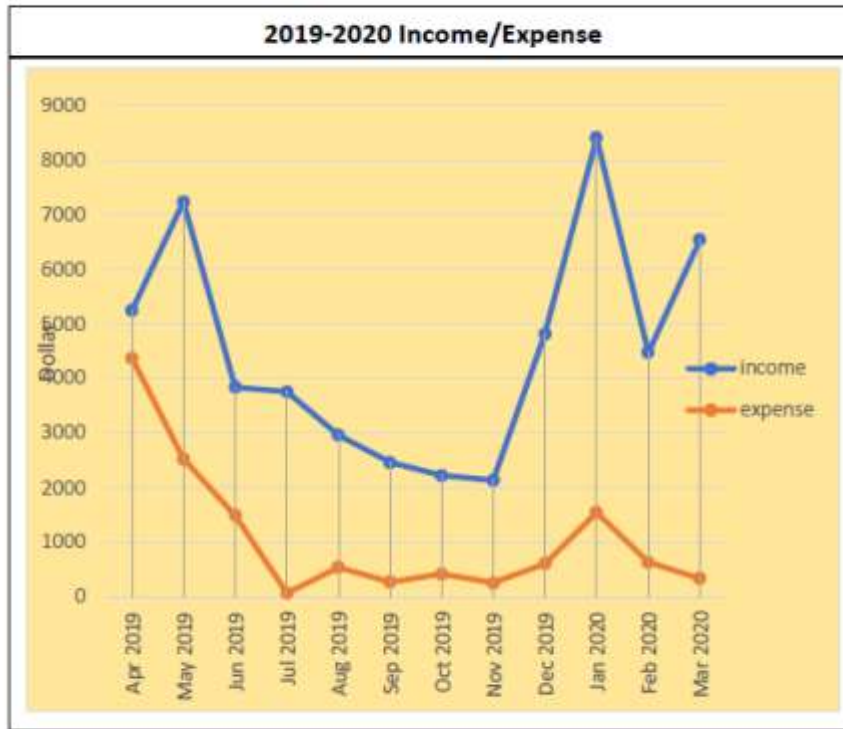


2019-2020 Contributions & Grants Month

TNF ABC INITIATIVE

The goal of TNF's ABC initiative is to enrich and empower underprivileged students by providing resources, programs, and tools currently not provided by the government.

The initial focus of the project was to enable grade level proficiency for underprivileged rural students who otherwise will become school dropouts. The current focus is on the entire student population, ranging from academically challenged to highly ambitious students.

TNF appointed Project Coordinators and teachers to work in close collaboration with the school teachers. Overall 79,901 students have benefitted through the ABC initiative in 25 districts as of March 2020.

The three components of the model are:

Achieving academic proficiency (The focus is on “academically challenged” students from 6th to 10th grades. One-third of the students in government schools are far below their grade level in basic reading and writing skills. In high schools, due to public exam expectations and pressure, they are likely to become school dropouts. The ABC Class helps them to improve and become grade proficient.)

Boosting their morale (For all students: Training, Workshops, and Summer Camps - to address 'soft skills' like self-confidence, communication skills, time management, goal setting, teamwork, etc).

Championing for higher aspirations (10th to 12th grades: Preparing for public exams, orientation to college education, career guidance, scholarships, campus visits, career guidance, internships, job placement, becoming role models)

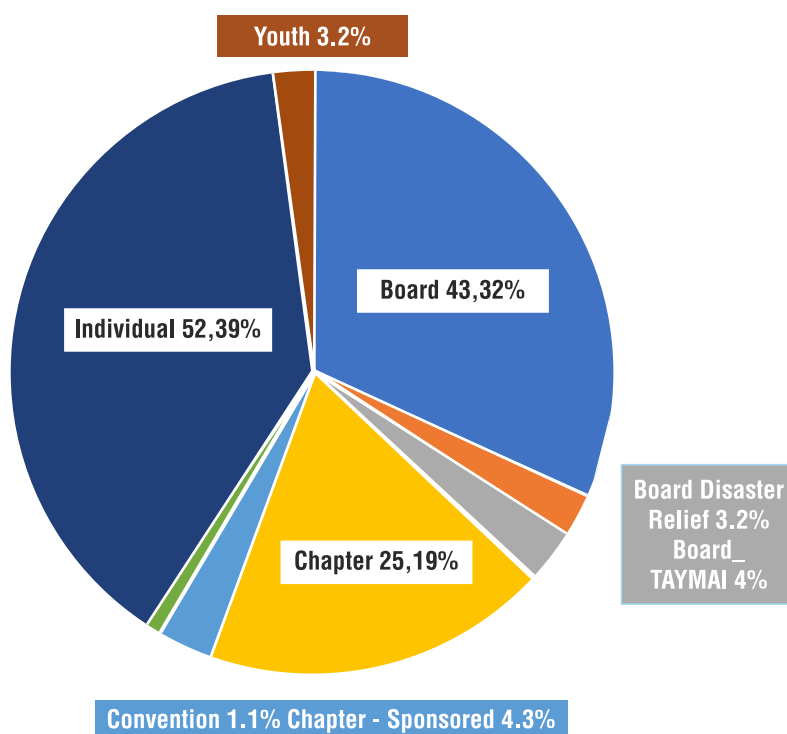

TAMILNADU FOUNDATION CHAPTERS - ANNUAL REPORT - JUNE 2020

TNF Chapters across the U.S are the ambassadors and on-the-ground messengers of the mission and vision of TNF. Chapters host a wide-variety of fund raisers, hold information sessions, collaborate with other Tamil diaspora-based outfits, inspire and involve the next generation in pursuing the noble mission of TNF USA.

U.S. based chapters together hosted more than 30 events across the nation and raised more than \$ 250,000+ * during the period of June 2019 thru May 2020.

While the onset the world-wide COVID-19 pandemic curtailed some of the chapter events, it has not dampened the spirit to help others in need. Chapters continue to raise funds online through creative ways to help food banks in the U.S. and join hands in the larger effort of fund raising for relief efforts in India. It is noteworthy that Chicago Chapter spearheaded the procurement of a COVID-19 testing machine, RT-PCR, for Stanley Medical College, at an estimated cost of Rs. 33 lakhs. The required funds were raised within a span of three weeks. In addition to rapid testing of Corona virus this machine will be used in the future for education and research purposes.

TNF received applications for TAYMAI grants in early 2020. After a thorough review of the submissions, using strict criteria, the Young Professional Committee (YPC) selected three winners for the issuance of the **2020 TAYMAI grants**:

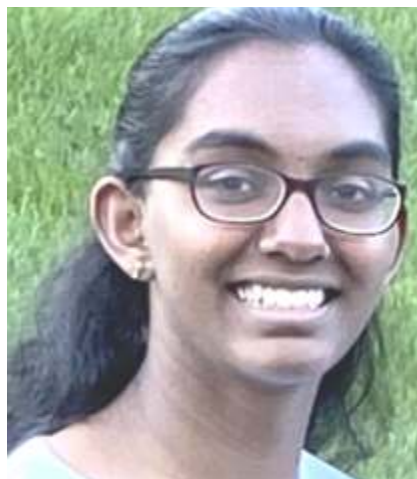
ABIRAMI CHINNAKARUPPAN: EYEducation for You (\$1500)



*I believe every child deserves fair access to education, and to avail of this opportunity, good eyesight is of paramount importance. **The scope of my project is two-fold: to provide eye screening for children, and if remedial steps need to be taken, follow it through with a treatment plan. I have selected a school in Karaikudi for this initiative, in collaboration with Aravind EyeHospital.** The total budget for the initial phase of the project is \$ 5,000 and so far I have raised \$ 4,395. My original plan was to implement this project in June of 2020. However, due to the pandemic, I have put the project on hold. I plan to execute my project after schools reopen.*

SHANTHI BHASKAR: Infrastructure for GHS School Arasangudi (\$1000)

*Through Tamilnadu Foundation's summer internship program, I visited the Arasangudi Government Higher Secondary School near Trichy, in July 2019. **After seeing the poor amenities at the school, I decided to raise funds to help set up a library, improve the IT Lab, and give a facelift to the girl's restrooms with the support of TNF.** The work in the library is estimated to cost around \$2000. The work to improve the IT Lab and refurbish the girl's restrooms will cost approximately \$3000 and \$5000, respectively. Through the support of Kansas City Tamil Sangam and the generous donations from friends and family, I have been able to raise \$4600 so far towards the project. The construction work on the library and the IT Lab is almost complete. Due to the prevailing pandemic situation, finishing the pending tasks with the library, IT lab, and the improvement of girl's restrooms are projected to be completed by early next year*

Learning at One's Own Phase for Success (LOOPS, \$ 500)

*The goal of LOOPS project is to assist children, who are behind their peers and have difficulty to master the lessons, to learn at their own pace and get integrated back into the mainstream as early as possible. This is accomplished by **providing kids with a digital product called "Talking Pen" and it helps teachers to selectively focus on students who need further attention.** For a classroom of 30 kids, it would cost around \$1850. We have collected \$500 through fund-raising activities. The project will be executed by us when we travel to India, and if we are unable to make the trip, it will be carried through by TNF staff in Chennai or our relatives. Expected completion date is March 2021.*

GAJA CYCLONE RELIEF EFFORTS 2019 - 2020

Cyclone Gaja devastated many lives in the coastal districts of Tamil Nadu in November 2018. Thiruvarur, Nagapattinam, Thanjavur, and Pudukkottai districts were the most affected areas.

Responding with a sense of utmost emergency, TNF immediately organized a fundraising campaign. With the support of its Chapters, partner organizations, and numerous individuals, TNF was able to extend relief to the people in the affected areas as listed below:

Immediate Relief Work :

Food distribution for 2000	- Thiruvarur and Nagapattinam Districts
Relief Materials for 10,507	- Thiruvarur and Nagapattinam Districts
Medical Camp for 2000	- Nagapattinam and Thiruvarur Districts
Coconut seedlings to 3200 farmers	- LN Puram, Pudukkottai District
Clean-up of uprooted trees	- LN Puram, Pudukkottai District
20 Solar Street Lights	- LN Puram in Pudukkottai District

TNF collaborated with the Government of Tamil Nadu under the Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana (PMAY) Scheme to help 100 beneficiaries in Thiruvarur and Nagapattinam districts to construct concrete houses for the economically underserved. The following is the list of the projects completed in 2019-2020.

1. 'Roof for the Roofless' Project :

Construction of Basement to 100 houses in Nagapattinam and Thiruvarur Districts, which benefited 100 families (project cost of Rs.47 lakhs).

2. Rehabilitation works at schools:

- 2a. Kasturba Gandhi Kanya Gurukulam Girls Higher Secondary School, Vedaranyam, Nagapattinam District:
Construction of Annapoornalayam (Dining Hall & Kitchen) - for the benefit of 950 students at the Gurukulam (project cost of Rs. 56 lakhs).
- 2b. Thiruvalluvar Arulneri Middle School, Korukkai, Thiruvarur District :
Construction of an additional 2 classrooms to accommodate 140 students (project cost of Rs.14.40 lakhs).
- 2c. Government Hr. Sec. School, Nedumbalam, Thiruvarur District :
Construction of Auditorium with a capacity for 850 students (project cost of Rs. 9.14 lakhs)

THE SPECIAL PROJECTS

With the continued generosity of many donors, TNF has been able to sustain a few special projects such as scholarships, upgrade ABC partner-schools facilities and libraries, introduce digital classrooms, and cater to special-need children, to name a few.

Libraries Are Temples

Libraries are quite sparse in the urban and rural areas of Tamil Nadu, let alone in small villages. Inspired by a young intern Umayal Natesan of Pittsburgh, TNF has commenced the 'Libraries are Temples' initiative to establish at least one functional library per district with proper infrastructure that would have modern digital facilities and attract children and students who would use such facilities on a regular basis.

Recent Library Projects

Ponneri Public Library, Thiruvallur District. One of the State's first computer centers in a public library. It has a separate room dedicated to public service exam materials.

Ashok Nagar Government Circle Library, Chennai. Fully renovated by TNF at a cost of Rs.65 lakhs after 2015 floods.

Somalay Memorial Library, Sivagangai. New building with computer and internet facility. Free computer classes and summer camps for students.

Kalayarkurichi Village Library, Virudhunagar District. A new building, digital learning center, tutoring for students.

Anvarthikanpet Library, Ranipet District. The Library was renovated at a cost exceeding Rs. 70,000. NTTF, a Corporate sponsor has provided six computers. Mr. Sivasailam, the past president of TNF, has generously donated reference books for the public exams.

Digital Classrooms

"Smart Classroom Pilot Project," Vadasithur Govt. Hr Sec School, Coimbatore: This enables teachers to harness the power of digital technology to supplement their traditional teaching materials with interactive videos aligned with the syllabus. The teachers are trained on a quarterly basis, with access to technical support from a Call Center.

"Self-Guided Digital Classroom", Govt. Hr. Sec School, Arumbakkam: This enables middle-school students to learn mathematics with the aid of digital technology. TNF Life Member Sam Senguttuvan provided funds for computers and necessary hardware. About 250 students will benefit from this project every year.

Kidney Disease - Screening and Education (TNF Connecticut Chapter)

Lack of awareness and access to health care leads to the onset of diabetes and associated complications, such as kidney failure and blindness in rural India. SIGARAM is a screening program for early detection. Patients with abnormalities will be given referral information about providers/facilities for additional follow-up. The project was piloted in February 2018 at Rajapalayam, Virudhunagar District. Screening was done for 200 patients. Patients with abnormal results were given referrals to physicians and clinics for further evaluation. Screening will be conducted annually.

Anbalayam – Loving Home for Special Needs Children

'Anbalayam, located in the rural town of Sirkali, is the home for 65 special-needs children, who used to live in squalid conditions. In 2006, Dr. Somasundaram spearheaded a fund drive with the support from TNF, Philadelphia Tamil Community; Stage Friends, USA, NJ; Tamil Sangam of Central Indiana; and Sastha Tamil Foundation, Dallas. From the funds generated, TNF has built a 3000 square-foot house, furnished classrooms, separate toilet/bathroom facilities for boys and girls. More importantly, a corpus fund has been set to the tune of one crore rupees to sustainably meet operating expenses.'

A physician provides weekly basic medical checkups for the children.

In 2019 TNF Dallas Chapter along with the support of Dallas Tamil Community and many partners, raised funds to build a dining hall, and provide a commercial washer.
